

Webcor's Bowles Elected President of Construction Employers' Association

CONCORD — John Bowles, senior vice president of Webcor Builders of San Mateo, was elected the 2006 president of the Construction Employers' Association during the group's recent 19th annual dinner meeting at the Concord Hilton.

Also elected were Bill Stronck, president of Gonsalves & Stronck Construction Co., as first vice president; Chuck Palley, president of Cahill Contractors, as vice president; and Jim Losch, chairman and founder of Hallmark Construction and CEA past president, as treasurer. Michael Walton, president of Employers' Advocate Inc., continues to serve as CEA's secretary.
